

FIRST READING: Isaiah 1:10-18

I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats.

New moon and sabbath and calling of convocation— I cannot endure solemn assemblies with iniquity.

though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool.

- 1 Happy are those whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.
- 2 Happy are those to whom the Lord imputes no iniquity,

and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

- 3 While I kept silence,
 - my body wasted away through my groaning all day long.
- 4 For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer. (Selah)
- 5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not hide my iniquity;
- I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the guilt of my sin. (Selah)
- 6 Therefore let all who are faithful offer prayer to you; at a time of distress, the rush of mighty waters shall not reach them.

³We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of everyone of you for one another is increasing. ⁴Therefore we ourselves boast of you among the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith during all your persecutions and the afflictions that you are enduring.
